The development of distinct measures of explicit and implicit knowledge is of great importance for second language research. In this talk, I present a conceptual replication of my previous work (Suzuki & DeKeyser, 2015 in *Language Learning*) where the validity of elicited imitation and word-monitoring tasks was examined as measures of implicit knowledge. This study is an ongoing collaboration project with my colleagues that uses an fMRI technique, exploring the neural correlates of explicit and implicit knowledge.
